Worship Update - Where are we going?

Over the past year I've been preparing a vision document to help us define where we see God taking us in worship and practical ways to get there.

It's our goal and heart for our church family to actively worship God in their daily lives and to come before Him in all things, surrendering to Him. Worship is surrender. When we surrender, we allow God to move. It's important we understand what that looks like for our church, the standards we hold ourselves to as leaders and the desire we have for what our church body can achieve in and through the act of worship.

Although we realize that we have no control over the response of any individual, when we plan our Sunday Service around these measures, we are doing our part in helping our church to surrender and make way for

We do our best to prepare our hearts, minds and talents to give our best to our Church and God through our voices and instruments. We hold one another accountable for these things and have honest conversations about how we are doing. We realize that practice is important, not for the sake of perfection but to reduce distraction and to help our church worship. We believe that supernatural acts can occur through the power of worship. Surrender to God - worship Him and praise Him with us.

Worship is surrender. When we surrender, we allow God to move.

Our Vision

Expecting the Powerful Presence of God: We do not just direct ourselves toward Him. We earnestly seek His drawing near to us according to His promise. We believe that in worship God draws near to us in power, and makes Himself known and felt for our good and for the salvation of unbelievers in our midst.

Bible Saturated: The content of our singing, praying, welcoming and preaching will always conform to the truth of Scripture. The content of God's Word will be evident through all we do in worship and will be the foundation of all our actions and decisions.

Head and Heart: Worship that aims at kindling and carrying deep, strong, real emotions toward God, but does not manipulate people's emotions by failing to appeal to clear thinking about spiritual things based on shareable evidences outside ourselves

Authentic Communication: Not the atmosphere of artistic or overblown performance but the atmosphere of a radically personal encounter with God's truth. Avoiding a trite, flippant, superficial, frivolous atmosphere, but instead setting an example of reverence, passion and wonder.

Undistracted Excellence: We will try to sing, play, pray and preach in such a way that people's attention will not be diverted from the substance by unpracticed, or ill prepared ministry nor by excessive finesse, elegance or refinement. Natural, undistracted excellence will let the truth and beauty of God shine through.

Participation and Performance: We encourage and anticipate a strong participation during sung worship at Country Hills. We value music that is current, timeless, singable and expresses a full range of responses to God. Sung worship provides an excellent opportunity to teach how we are able to best relate to our heavenly Father.

Missions Update


Ray and Kelly Marshall - Navigators, Waterloo ON

Missions Work here in Waterloo - How's God moving?

Ray and Kelly Marshall are fairly new to us here at CHC. We began our support to them and their ministry within this past year.

The Marshalls are part of the Navigator organization which has a strong focus not just on evangelism but on discipleship as well.

Ray and Kelly have had a heart to reach those who do not know Christ since they were first married. They spent some time in the UK, several years in



So, what's happening now, here in Waterloo? Ray and Kelly lead a ministry to Chinese students and visiting scholars who come to one of our city's Universities.

What's the big draw for Chinese students to join the group? Probably the biggest draw is that we speak English! It is a chance for them to practice their English in a safe and accepting environment.

The next draw is that we study the Bible and investigate the truth claims of Christianity. For people coming from a communist, atheist society, this is very interesting!

The Bible study is every Friday evening and it is very fruitful! Every year there are a number of Chinese who come to faith in Jesus. Then begins the process of helping them to grow in their faith and understanding of scripture. Ray and Kelly open their home for weekly studies as well as meet with students during the day if that is a better time period for them.

The Marshalls also lead an ESL cafe every Wednesday evening at Lincoln Road Chapel (the home base for this ministry). Ray also teaches ESL at the U of W every Thursday evening.

The team working with Ray and Kelly also plan special trips and parties with our Chinese friends. We have summer picnics and beach trips, Christmas and Thanksgiving parties and movie and bowling nights.

It is an exciting work in which to be involved.

Intellectually Speaking

Over the past year on and off I have been writing about sacred pathways. These are different ways we interact with God. If you're wondering what your sacred pathways might be you can take the survey for yourself here www.northpoint.org/care/pathways

The final sacred pathway in our series is that of the intellectual. Intellectuals love God with their mind and their hearts as they learn, study, debate, and discover. Sometimes intellectuals end up working as apologists, professors, authors, and theologians. If you like to connect your mind to your faith, feel closer to God as you do, and

prefer not to check your brains at the door then this is likely one of your sacred pathways.


Intellectuals don't have to be the smartest person in the room, they simply tend to connect with God deeply as they learn and discover. With open hearts and minds they drink deep as they scratch beneath the surface of teaching, concepts, and passages that others take at face value.

Discovering the background and context of a parable, grasping a theological concept, or learning how to answer questions about our faith to seekers are all examples of how intellectuals connect with God and serve others.

If this is you then I want to encourage you to keep exploring, learning, and digging. What you find fascinating others may find dry, but don't let this discourage you. I'll leave you with some words Jesus said that apply as well to intellectuals.

"And so I tell you, keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep

on knocking, and the door will be opened to you. 10 For everyone who asks, receives. Everyone who seeks, finds. And to everyone who knocks, the door will be opened." - Jesus (Luke 11:9-10 NLT)
